

Course Descriptions

English



ENG 1101: English Composition I Credit Hours: 3
In English Composition I students learn reflective, analytical and argumentative writing strategies, incorporating sources and personal experience. Students will negotiate between public and private rhetorical situations and purposes to achieve academic literacy. They will write multiple drafts using a recursive writing process as they work toward fluency in style and mechanics.



ENG 1201: English Composition II Credit Hours: 3
English Composition II, building on the skills in English Composition I, develops rhetorical literacy through research, critical reading and multigenre writing tasks. Through major and minor, cumulative and stand-alone assignments, students construct arguments and analyses, ethically incorporating academic sources while developing their own voices as writers and citizens.



LIT 1600: Introduction to Literature Credit Hours: 3
Critical readings, discussion and analysis of poetry, fiction, and drama.



ENG 2300: Great Books: World Literature Credit hours: 3
Chronological selection of the major works, genres, and periods of world literature beginning with the ancients and progressing through modern times.

SPN 1111: Spanish 1 Credit Hours 3

Beginning-level vocabulary and structures of Spanish. Practice speaking, reading, writing, and listening in the target language. Introduction to indicative mood of regular and irregular verbs; preterit and imperfect. Not for credit if successfully completed equivalent course at any other accredited institution.

SPN 1112: Spanish 2 Credit Hours: 3

Further study of the vocabulary and structure of the Spanish language; practice in speaking, reading, listening comprehension, and writing. Introduction to commands, present and imperfect subjunctive moods, future, and conditional. Not for credit if successfully completed equivalent course at any other accredited institution

SPN 2111 Intermediate Spanish 1 Credit Hours: 3

Integration of learning outcomes across Interpersonal, Interpretive, and Presentational Modes of Communication. Accomplish real-world communicative tasks in culturally appropriate ways and gain familiarity with products, practices, and perspectives of the target culture(s). Use grammar, vocabulary, and structures for meeting functional performance goals at this level and to build a foundation for continued language learning. Consistently perform in the Novice range. More abilities emerge and develop in the Intermediate range.

SPN 2112 Intermediate Spanish 2 Credit hours: 3

Integration of learning outcomes across Interpersonal, Interpretive, and Presentational Modes of Communication. Accomplish real-world communicative tasks in culturally appropriate ways and gain familiarity with products, practices, and perspectives of the target culture(s). Use grammar, vocabulary, and structures for meeting functional performance goals at this level and to build a foundation for continued language learning. PHY 1501 General Physics 1 Credit Hours: 5

College algebra based physics to include: kinematics in one and two dimensions; vector arithmetic; force and Newton's Laws of Motion and Gravitation; work, energy, and conservation of energy; linear momentum and collisions; rotational kinematics and dynamics, including angular momentum and rotational energy; simple harmonic motion; waves and sound; fluids and elasticity; heat and thermodynamics; kinetic theory of gases; collection, analysis and reporting of data; problem-solving using college algebra concepts
