Greenon Junior High School



8th Grade Scheduling Information 2020-2021

800 8th Reading/Language Arts......All Year

8th Reading/Language Arts encompasses both reading and language components as outlined in the Common Core Standards. This course is aimed at developing students' reading and writing skills at a higher level. Critical thinking and the ability to use evidence and cite sources are a major component for success. One major difference throughout the year is an expanded focus on informational text. These texts will be mixed with literary texts, as well as examined independently. Students will develop their reading, written, and communication skills with various in-depth projects, such as: research papers, essays, speeches, debates, and more.

Course Fee: \$35

820 8th Math..... All Year

This course will develop the fundamental principles of algebra. Course topics will include algebraic symbolism, simplifying equations, solutions to elementary equations and graphic representations associated with variables. This course will introduce algebraic processes applied to word problems. Students will use rational numbers, irrational numbers, exponents, powers, roots, ratios, proportions, and percentages. They solve simple linear equations and inequalities; graph functions and understand the concepts of slope and rate; construct shapes that meet given conditions and apply geometric concepts to solve problems; convert between units of measure and use rates and scale factors to solve problems; collect, organize, represent, and interpret relationships in data sets that have one or more variables; make decisions about how to solve problems and communicate their ideas.

Course Fee: \$10.00

830 8th Science...... All Year

8th grade science is a general science class covering a variety of content standards. We will be following the Ohio's science curriculum, which includes Earth and Space Science, Life Science, Physical Science, Science and Technology, along with Scientific Inquiry. Hands-on lab activities will be combined with technology web quests, note taking and other group projects. Vocabulary note cards/flashcards play a big part in each topic covered. Any work that is not finished in class will be considered extended class work/homework and is expected to be completed by the given deadline.

Course Fee: \$20.00

840 8th American History...... All Year

8th grade students will begin the study of American History with the early colonies and finish with the Civil War and Reconstruction. Study guides with a power point presentation are generally used to engage the students to cover the information. There is work usually every day with note cards being a large part of the homework grade. Tests are a mixture of multiple choice questions with some short answer and essays and completed on the computer. Students are required to complete one major paper due usually sometime in February that deals with the Constitution Unit. Major units include: The Colonies, the American Revolution, the Constitution, the Lewis and Clark Expedition, the Jackson Era, and Westward Expansion. Highlighted at the end of the year will be the annual trip to Washington DC.

Course Fee: \$15.00

Students will be given placement tests prior to the end of 7th grade to determine if they are eligible for these high school credit courses: Algebra 1, Physical Science or Spanish 1. Eligible students will be notified through a letter sent home before the last day of school.

*This course is for high school credit and will be included in the cumulative high school GPA

Prerequisite: In order to be placed in this class, you must have successfully completed Advanced Math 7 <u>OR</u> have an appropriate placement test score <u>AND</u> a grade of A- or higher in each quarter of 7th grade math.

This is a higher level course and homework is expected to be given each day. Many of the assignments may require more time to complete than students have been used to devoting time to at home. Some of the topics that will be discussed are: real numbers, linear equations and inequalities, graphs, relations, functions, systems of equations, polynomials, factoring, quadratics, exponential functions, rational expressions and equations, as well as square roots.

Course Fee: \$15.00

*This course is for high school credit and will be included in the cumulative high school GPA

Prerequisite: In order to be placed in this class, you must have an appropriate placement test score <u>AND</u> a grade of A- or higher in each quarter of 7th grade science. Students must also be enrolled in Algebra 1.

This course contributes to the AIR test and develops standards-based knowledge and skills. Course includes atoms, chemical reactions, physical properties, mixtures and solutions, laws of motion, forces, energy, waves, properties of celestial bodies, historical perspectives and emerging issues; relationship between technology and science; diversity of scientific investigations, scientific theories, scientific literacy, scientific conclusions, and modeling investigations.

Course Fee: \$25.00

*This course is for high school credit and will be included in the cumulative high school GPA

Prerequisite: In order to be placed in this class, you must have an appropriate placement test score **AND** a grade of A- or higher in each quarter of 7th grade English.

Novice students speak in short sentences that contain learned words and phrases. Students understand the target language when it is spoken using short, simple phrases and sentences. Students write short sentences which contain learned words and phrases and read brief texts with comprehension. At the end of level one, students will be able to listen, speak, read, and write at a novice level using the grammatical structures and vocabulary introduced throughout the year. Students must have a strong understanding of English grammar and mechanics and should be prepared for nightly assignments.

Course Fee: \$15.30

The required electives for 8th grade students are: 1 semester of STEM, 9 weeks of Physical Education and 9 weeks of Technology. Students may select additional electives to complete their schedule. 8th grade students may not have more than one study hall each semester.

833 8th STEM...... 1 Semester

This is a course designed for 8th graders who would like to take an engineering science in addition to the traditional 8th grade science course. This class focuses on the engineering design process and many 8th/9th science standards will be emphasized. This is a hands-on, collaborative course in which the students will attempt to devise solutions to real world challenges.

Course Fee: \$25.00

890 8th Technology......9 weeks

Students will develop an understanding of technology concepts and relationships between technologies and other fields. Students will learn that the development of emerging technology is exponential, driven by history, design, commercialization and shaped by inventive thinking, economic factors and cultural influences. An understanding of digital citizenship, analyzing trends, ethical and legal use of technology will be integrated into this course.

Students will practice keyboarding skills and produce publications and presentations with a basic understanding of hardware and software applications. Additionally, students will learn to evaluate the reliability of web site information. Problem solving via information technology is a central theme in this course. Students will study design, inventions and technologies related to a variety of career fields; for example, agriculture, biotechnology, science and engineering.

Course Fee: None

Students in Physical Education class in Greenon Local Schools will be able to:

- Demonstrate competency in motor skills and movement patterns needed to perform a variety of physical activities
- Demonstrate understanding of movement concepts, principles, strategies and tactics as they apply to the learning and performance of physical activities
- Participate regularly in physical activity
- Achieve and maintains a health-enhancing level of physical fitness
- Exhibit responsible personal behavior and social behavior that respects self and others in physical activity settings
- Value physical activity for health, enjoyment, challenge, self-expression and/or social interaction

Course Fee: None

880 8th Visual Arts...... Semester

The Junior High Art Program at Greenon Local Schools is based on the Visual Elements and Principles of Design and is supported by The Ohio Department of Education Content Standards. Art Theory, Art History, Art Response (Written and Verbal), and Art Appreciation are all included with personal expression through Art Making. The 4 C's are addressed on a regular basis; Creativity (and Imagination), Critical Thinking, Problem Solving, and Collaboration. A variety of mediums/techniques are used in this experience, including: painting, printmaking, and sculpture (clay, plus).

Course Fee: \$22.00

This course is designed to provide students with an introduction to business concepts to gain a general understanding of business operations and strategies. Students will learn about the five Ps of marketing:

- Product
- Price
- Promotions
- Place
- People

Students will develop skills in file management, word processing, presentation and the basics of spreadsheet applications while integrating the academic standards for Language Arts and Mathematics. Using basic understanding of hardware and software applications, students will produce publications, financial statements and presentations. Students will complete projects to apply skills for various business scenarios and to study entrepreneurship. Additionally, students will be introduced to financial modeling and the law of supply and demand.

Students will gain an understanding of agencies such as the Chamber of Commerce and the Small Business Administration that support businesses. The following projects are examples of the type of work to be completed:

- TV Commercial
- Magazine Advertisement
- Animated Online Promotion
- Local Business Research
- Business Plan
- Career Exploration / Plan for Business, Finance, or Marketing

Creativity, analytical skills and team work are central themes in this course.

Course Fee: None

318 Public Speaking...... 1 Semester..................0.50 Credit

*This course is for high school credit and will be included in the cumulative high school GPA

Public speaking is designed to help students improve their oral communication skills. Students will learn how to compose different types of speeches and presentations, and students will learn different methods of organization and ways of appealing to an audience. Students will also learn techniques to use for effective oral presentations. Solid writing skills and basic research skills are necessary for success in the course. The semester exam will count as 1/5 of the semester grade.

Course Fee: None

850 8th Band...... All Year

The eighth grade band is a yearlong course that continues refining the musical skills acquired in seventh grade band. This ensemble performs two concerts a year: a Winter Concert held in December and a Spring Concert held in May. Membership is open to any student that has at least two years of playing experience on a traditional band instrument (Flute, Oboe, Clarinet, Bassoon, Saxophone, Trumpet, Horn, Trombone, Baritone, Tuba or percussion). The eighth grade band participates in a Music in the Parks Festival every other year, performing for a panel of judges in the Cincinnati area and then attending Kings Island for the day.

Course Fee: \$20.00

*This course is for high school credit and will be included in the cumulative high school GPA

This course will serve as an introduction to playing the guitar. It is ideal for those that have never played guitar or those that have played guitar but cannot read music. Topics covered in this course include reading standard notation in first position, chords in first position, blues and improvisation. This class will utilize the textbook "Sound Innovations". Student must provide their own steel string or nylon string acoustic guitar.

Course Fee: \$15.00

*This course is for high school credit and will be included in the cumulative high school GPA

Prerequisite: Student must successfully complete Guitar I.

This course is a continuation of Guitar I. It will review and build upon the skills taught in Guitar I.

Course Fee: No course fee. Guitar II uses the same book as Guitar 1

852 8th Choir..... All Year

Students perform at two annual choir concerts in December and May. Students are taught to read music, match pitch, and sing a selected vocal part. The textbook used for sight-reading is "Sing at First Sight Book I". Each student earns a grade through clapping/singing tests, effort, and participation in concerts. Students are also encouraged to participate in an extra-curricular performance activity. The Drama Club Musical is offered to grades 7-12 during 2nd semester.

Course Fee: \$20.00

College Credit Plus

Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, College Credit Plus (CCP) replaces Ohio's Post Secondary Enrollment Options program (PSEO) and all alternative dual enrollment programs previously governed by Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3365. Greenon Local Schools has partnered with Clark State Community College and Sinclair Community College to provide early college credit to our 7th-12th grade students at Greenon Jr Senior High. College Credit Plus gives high school students the opportunity to take college courses at any area college at no cost and receive college credit while still in high school. Students will have the following options for taking classes: On-campus or online at any area college, at Greenon Jr. Senior High taught by a credentialed high school teacher, at Greenon Jr. Senior High taught by a Sinclair or Clark State instructor, or online, taught by a Sinclair or Clark State instructor and proctored by one of our high school teachers. CCP will give students: 1) early exposure to college coursework, rigor, and expectations. 2) challenging coursework options. 3) opportunity to complete college coursework within a strong and familiar support system at the high school. 4) CCP options provide students with an early and strong foundation for college success.

The Ohio Transfer Module (OTM) is a subset or a complete set of general education requirements at Ohio public colleges and universities. OTM courses are **guaranteed** to transfer to any of Ohio's public institutions of higher education as an earned credit, as well as equivalent courses in English and Mathematics.

Any student interested in CCP MUST complete a CCP application by **April 1st**. For more information, please contact the Guidance Office.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score

In English Composition I students learn reflective, analytical and argumentative writing strategies, incorporating sources and personal experience. Students will negotiate between public and private rhetorical situations and purposes to achieve academic literacy. They will write multiple drafts using a recursive writing process as they work toward fluency in style and mechanics.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of English credit at the high school level. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: ENG 1101 and/or remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

English Composition II, building on the skills in English Composition I, develops rhetorical literacy through research, critical reading and multigenre writing tasks. Through major and minor, cumulative and stand-alone assignments, students construct arguments and analyses, ethically incorporating academic sources while developing their own voices as writers and citizens.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of English credit at the high school level. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Prerequisite: ENG 1101 and/or remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score

This course is designed to explore various facets of communication in the workplace. Students will prepare and analyze business documents using fundamental business communication principles and standards, technology, critical thinking skills, and research techniques in preparation for the workplace. Additionally, students will develop oral communication skills using appropriate technology, strategy, and methods.

Students will gain experience speaking and writing clearly and accurately in a variety of contexts and formats. This course includes the following learning activities:

- Examine critically the flow of communication in organizations, including barriers and methods for overcoming those barriers
- Prepare effective business messages.
- Compose positive and negative letters and messages using the proper pattern.
- Practice the basic features of business reports, including functions, correct strategies (indirect or direct), writing style, and formats.
- Organize and present an effective and informal business report--investigative report.
- Research intercultural traditions and ethics, including business practices abroad, bribery, prevailing customs, and methods for coping with ethical dilemma.
- Compose persuasive messages using a variety of techniques.

This course is especially designed for students considering careers in communications, organizational leadership, business administration, international business and marketing.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of an elective credit at the high school level. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

ENG 2300 Great Books: World Literature.....1 Semester......Grade 7 – 12......1.0 Credit

Prerequisite: ENG 1101 and/or remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

Chronological selection of the major works, genres, and periods of world literature beginning with the ancients and progressing through modern times.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

LIT 2220 Introduction to Literature2 Semesters.......Grade 7 – 12......1.0 Credit

Prerequisite: ENG 1101 and/or remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

Introduction to Literature introduces students to the major literary genres of literature, including narrative fiction, poetry, and drama. Emphasis is placed on literary terminology and interpretation. Upon completion, students should be able to analyze and respond to literature. Students will effectively and ethically argue their interpretations of literary works using textual evidence and Modern Language Association (MLA) documentation. Special emphasis will be made during the 2nd semester on Women's Literature and the literary compositions by women.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score

Development of the people of the United States in political, social, economic, and cultural areas from pre-Columbian America through Reconstruction.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

HIS 1102 United States History II......1 Semester.....Grade 7- 12......1.0 Credit

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score

Development of the people of the United States in political, social, economic and cultural areas from Reconstruction to the present.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

PLS 1120 American Government......1 Semester......Grade 7 -12......1.0 Credit

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

American political system at the national level, including process of government; democratic theory and development of the U. S. Constitution; citizen participation through voting; interest groups and political parties; structure, functions and powers of legislative, executive and judicial branches; issues of civil liberties and equal rights.

*this course will serve as a substitute for Government credits. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

University-parallel course covering history and systems of psychology, behavioral research methods, physiology of behavior, sensation, perception, learning, memory, consciousness, cognition, personality, lifespan development, gender, social psychology, motivation, emotion, stress, mental disorders and therapies.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score

Major trends in the development of Western culture, emphasizing political, economic, social and cultural achievements, from prehistory to the seventeenth century.

*this course will not serve as a substitute for World History—World Civ II will need to be taken in addition. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Prerequisite: World Civilization I & remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score

Major trends in the development of Western culture, emphasizing political, economic, social and cultural achievements from the seventeenth century to the present.

*this course will serve as a substitute for World History. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

PLS 2220 International Relations.......1 Semester......Grade 7-12......1.0 Credit

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

Principles and techniques of international politics, including theories, organizations and different world perspectives.

* this course will fulfill 1 year of an elective credit; however, it will *not* be a substitution for World History, US History or Government credits. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

An introduction to the fundamental ideas of statistics, including statistical methods to gather, analyze and present data; fundamentals of probability; statistical distributions, sampling distributions, confidence intervals, hypothesis testing, Chi-square tests, regression and correlation.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

Polynomial, radical, rational, exponential and logarithmic functions and their graphs; roots of polynomial functions, rational and polynomial inequalities; systems of linear and nonlinear equations; matrices; and applications.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

MAT 1580 Pre-Calculus.......2 Semesters......Grade 7 – 12...........1.0 Credit

Prerequisite: MAT 1290 OR MAT 1365 OR MAT 1370 and/or remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

Polynomial, radical, rational, exponential and logarithmic functions and their graphs, roots of polynomial functions, rational and polynomial inequalities, conic sections, systems of linear equations; sequences and series. Trigonometric functions of angles, solving right and oblique triangles, trigonometric identities and equations, vectors, radian measure, graphs of trigonometric functions, inverse trigonometric functions and applications. A scientific (nongraphing) calculator is required.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of Math credit at the high school level. The student will earn 5 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: MAT 1570 or MAT 1580 and/or remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer test and/or ACT score.

Cartesian coordinate system, functions, limits and continuity of functions, the derivative and its applications, the integral and the Fundamental Theorem of Calculus. Derivatives and integrals involving piecewise, polynomial, rational, algebraic, exponential, logarithmic, trigonometric, inverse trigonometric and hyperbolic functions and their inverses.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of Math credit at the high school level. The student will earn 5 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

College algebra based physics to include: kinematics in one and two dimensions; vector arithmetic; force and Newton's Laws of Motion and Gravitation; work, energy, and conservation of energy; linear momentum and collisions; rotational kinematics and dynamics, including angular momentum and rotational energy; simple harmonic motion; waves and sound; fluids and elasticity; heat and thermodynamics; kinetic theory of gases; collection, analysis and reporting of data; problem-solving using college algebra concepts and methods.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of Science credit at the high school level. The student will earn 5 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score

College algebra based physics to include: electricity, magnetism, electromagnetism, geometric, and wave optics; relativity, quantum physics, atomic physics, nuclear physics, collection, analysis, and reporting of data; problem-solving using algebra concepts and methods.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of Science credit at the high school level. The student will earn 5 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: Remediation free score on Sinclair's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

A foundation for gaining knowledge about Hispanic culture and basic phrases related to simple spoken Spanish, including travel situations.

SPN 1111 Spanish 1......1 Semester......Grade 7 - 121.0 Credit

Prerequisite: ENG 1101 and a remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

Beginning-level vocabulary and structures of Spanish. Practice speaking, reading, writing, and listening in the target language. Introduction to indicative mood of regular and irregular verbs; preterit and imperfect. Not for credit if successfully completed equivalent course at any other accredited institution.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of a foreign language credit at the high school level and is <u>equivalent to Spanish 2</u>. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: SPN 1111, ENG 1101, and a remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

Further study of the vocabulary and structure of the Spanish language; practice in speaking, reading, listening comprehension, and writing. Introduction to commands, present and imperfect subjunctive moods, future, and conditional. Not for credit if successfully completed equivalent course at any other accredited institution

*this course will fulfill 1 year of a foreign language credit at the high school level and is **equivalent to Spanish 3**. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

Prerequisite: SPN 1111, SPN 1112, ENG 1101, and a remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

Integration of learning outcomes across Interpersonal, Interpretive, and Presentational Modes of Communication. Accomplish real-world communicative tasks in culturally appropriate ways and gain familiarity with products, practices, and perspectives of the target culture(s). Use grammar, vocabulary, and structures for meeting functional performance goals at this level and to build a foundation for continued language learning. Consistently perform in the Novice range. More abilities emerge and develop in the Intermediate range.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of a foreign language credit at the high school level and is equivalent to Spanish 4. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

SPN 2112 Intermediate Spanish 2......1 Semester......Grade 7 - 121.0 Credit

Prerequisite: SPN 1111, SPN 1112, SPN 2111, ENG 1101, and a remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

Integration of learning outcomes across Interpersonal, Interpretive, and Presentational Modes of Communication. Accomplish real-world communicative tasks in culturally appropriate ways and gain familiarity with products, practices, and perspectives of the target culture(s). Use grammar, vocabulary, and structures for meeting functional performance goals at this level and to build a foundation for continued language learning. Perform better and stronger in the Intermediate range. A few abilities emerge in the Advanced range.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of a foreign language credit at the high school level and is <u>equivalent to advanced</u> <u>Spanish beyond Spanish 4</u>. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.

Course Fee: all CCP tuition and textbook fees will be paid by Greenon Local Schools.

ITS 1005 Computer Concepts & Software Applications.......1 Semester.....Grade 7 - 12 ...1.0 Credit

Prerequisite: CPE 0200, ITS 0800, ITS0810 and/or a remediation free score on Clark State's Accuplacer and/or ACT score.

This course is designed to teach effective use of information technology skills for the business environment. Students will become proficient using Microsoft Office 2016 application software while learning the most efficient methods for creating documents and managing data. Students will become proficient in Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Access. Students will also learn basic computer concepts and terminology and will learn to differentiate among various operating systems

This course is especially designed for students considering careers in technical system support, office administration and business management.

*this course will fulfill 1 year of an elective credit at the high school level. The student will earn 3 college credits for this course.
